This ship was named after John Rowe's niece.

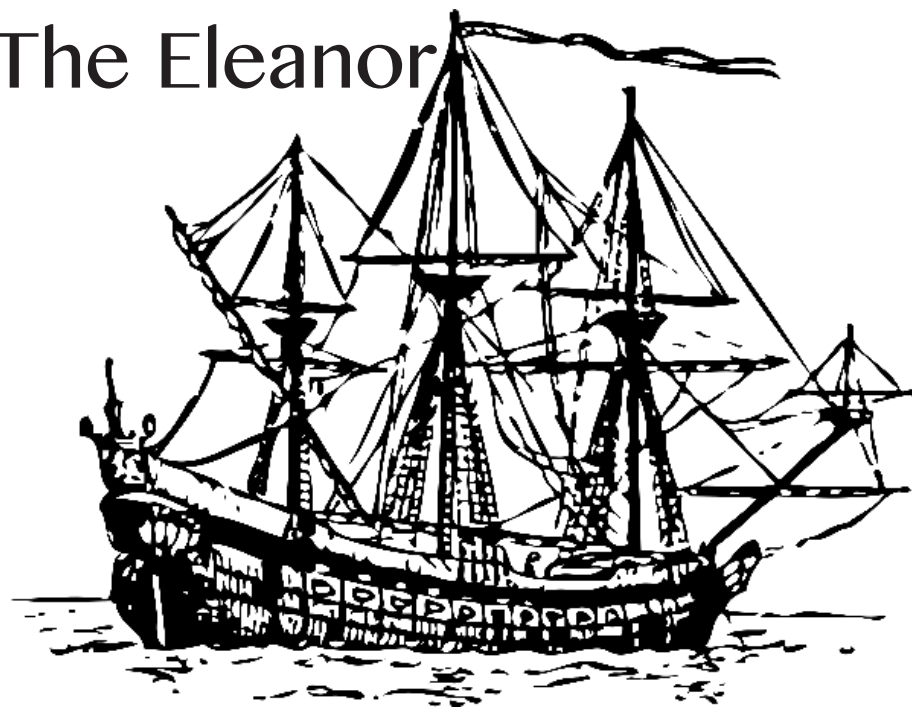
This ship was owned by John Rowe.

This ship was built in 1772 as a vessel to catch whales for Joseph Rotch.

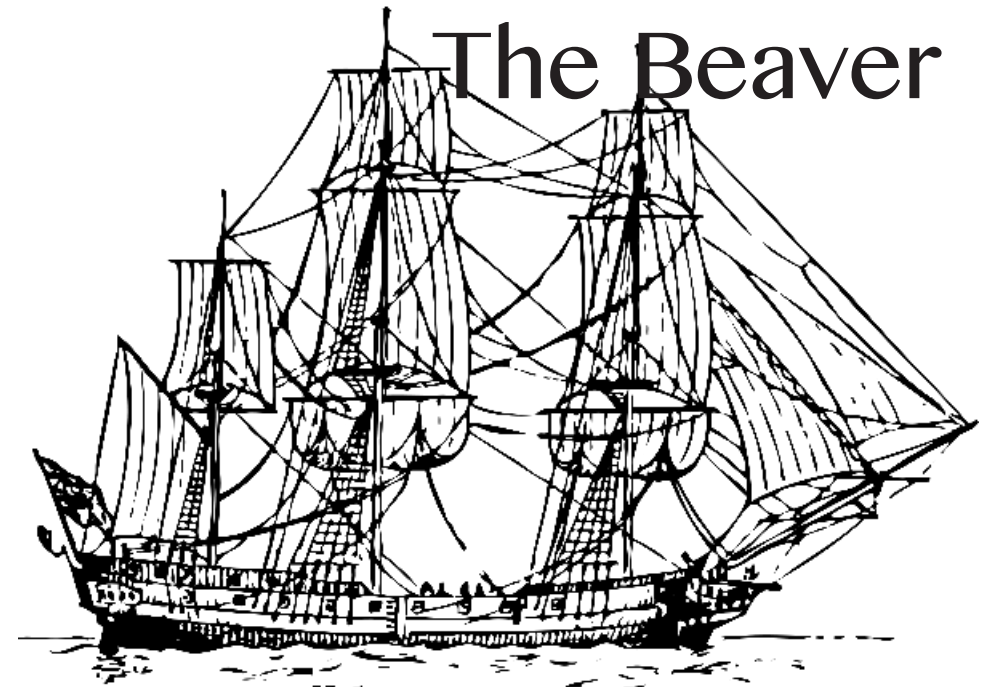
This ship was built by Ichabod Tomas.

This ship caught on fire on the way to the U.S. The blaze was contained after putting it out with water.

This ship carried 112 chests of tea.

This ship arrived at Boston Harbor on December 15, 1773.

There was an outbreak of smallpox on this ship.



This ship was the first “tea ship” to arrive in Boston.

This ship was owned by Joseph Rotch.

This ship arrived in Boston Harbor on November 28, 1773.

This ship was built in 1767.

This ship carried 114 chests of tea from the East India Company.
